### WHAT WE TREAT

This in-person IOP (intensive outpatient program) provides intensive treatment for people with OCD (obsessive compulsive disorder), OC-spectrum disorders and anxiety disorders. The program is focused on providing culturally informed, evidence-based treatment to help participants learn skills aimed at decreasing mental health symptoms and improving quality of life, relationships and executive functioning.

### WHAT WE OFFER

Our 12-week program meets 3 times per week for 3 hours each day and includes:

- Group therapy support
- Individual ERP (exposure and response prevention) sessions
- Medication management with a psychiatric specialist with a follow-up treatment plan
- Family psychoeducation sessions and support at least two times before discharge

### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- People 17 years of age or older
- Primary diagnosis of OCD, an OC-spectrum disorder, or anxiety
- Those who need more support beyond outpatient therapy, or who are stepping down from an inpatient or residential program, a substance use disorder program, or an eating disorder program
- Able to attend 9 hours/week in a group therapy setting on the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus in Aurora, Colorado
